What some of the terms mean

In order to qualify for prizes and awards, hounds must complete the three heats in "true racing style". In this field of 16 starters the first 5 completed all three programs and the remainder (highlighted) did not. While the **Turtle Award** is given to the lowest qualifying score, that hound raced and finished all three programs. A **Best of Opposite Sex High Score** is given to the top qualifying hound of the Opposite Sex to the High Score (HS) hound. **FTE** means this is the **First Time Entered** for that hound. **HS Conf.Ch**. Is awarded to the **High Score Conformation Champion**.

Points are given to the first few hounds (depending on the entries) for GRC (Gazehound Racing Champion) and NRC (National Racing Champion) and go towards earning titles of GRC and SGRC (Superior Gazehound Racing Champion), respectively.
